

A View From the Dock and Yard

Ahoy,

I know that you are aware that the summertime boating season has come to an end and winter is fast approaching. It's the time of year I encourage you all to please take some time from your busy schedules to come to the marina and check on your yachts.

Ensure that all your dock lines are in good condition, that you have chafing gear on them and no loose cleats. Check that all your covers are in good shape and secured correctly.

Also, check that your cockpit drains are clear and free of obstructions before the storms and rain arrive. It's also a good idea to check that your automatic bilge pumps are working correctly and intakes are clear of any debris that could clog them.

One of the ongoing issues is people leaving the Marina gates open and not closing them completely. Please ensure that the gates are closed and latched properly after using.

Another area of concern is the dry storage gate being left open. If the dry storage gate is not being actively used, please close the gate behind you. If someone is in the storage yard, they should have a keycard and be able to exit on their own. Never leave the dry storage gate open at night.

If you find that any marina gates or dry storage gates are not working properly, please report it to us immediately so that it can be corrected. If you see anything else in need of repair in our marina, please send emails to us at dean@cbyc.org and scottholcomb2014@gmail.com so it can be tracked and addressed in a timely manner.

Sue retired from nursing to care for Henry and upon his passing she returned to San Pedro where she felt most at home.

Sue is survived by her son, Jib Kelly (Kim) and daughter Staysail Kelly Gibbs (Stan) her grandchildren, Geoff Macellvin, Katie Steinhafel (David), Riley Gibbs and Sawyer Gibbs.





We finally did it! That is, anchor in Cuyler Harbor and hike on San Miguel Island. This trip marked my visit to the final island of the Channel Islands National Park and the seventh of all eight Channel Islands. It was a marvelous cruise with some slight alterations to the original itinerary due to weather but, we regrouped to take advantage of the weather windows and visit new and spectacularly gorgeous places.

While we originally expected quite a few more boats, our hearty group consisted of Azure and Thalassa. Covering around 275 NM our stops ranged from the resort marina in Oxnard to desolate but wonderful coves on the islands of Santa Barbara, Santa Cruz, Santa Rosa, and San Miguel. All stops were on a single hook. Painted Cave was the calmest ever for me; exploring the coves around Cueva Valdez was breathtaking; hiking the Torrey Pines Forest on Santa Rosa, marveling at the dolphins and herds of sea lions throughout the journey and seeing the waterfalls on San Miguel, just to name a few, were well worth the cruising distance. Setting the CBYC flag near our namesake's monument, written as "Joao Rodrigues Cabrillho" on the stone, was emotional.
