

Note: All slip tenants are required to have up-to-date insurance documents submitted to the Marina Office.

Please file a Float Plan when you will be absent from your slip. Remember, when you file a float plan, it allows the marina to offer your slip to a visiting yachtsman.

Born in Lorain, Ohio, she graduated from Ohio State University in 1971 and from Cleveland Marshall College of Law in 1975.



Steve & Patricia Altstatt





Thank you for volunteering last week to help make the Holiday Opti Regatta (Carrie Series #3) a successful regatta.

There were 98 entries this year, with 53 Opti's in the Championship Fleet! That is the largest number of racers to date, for the Holiday Opti Regatta.

Racing on Saturday began right on schedule. The wind had shifted to a south-westerly direction about 30 minutes before the scheduled first race warning at noon.

The race committee set up the windward leeward course with leeward gate. We were able to complete 4 races on Saturday with steady, moderate winds. Races 2, 3, and 4 were twice around, windward-leeward. We got the racers back to the dry storage area well before sunset. Warm food was served in the dry storage area by volunteers. Four races completed on Saturday.

Sunday morning started out with very light winds from the south. Racing was postponed due to light, unsettled conditions. The first race warning was scheduled to be at 11:30 am but was postponed until about 1 pm. Just minutes before 1 pm, a southerly wind settled in and the race committee did a fantastic job of setting up the course very quickly. Allowing us to start the first race of the day a few minutes after 1 pm. This was a short windward-leeward once around course.
